

Westfield Test Score Profile

Westfield offers a rigorous curriculum to prepare every student for college. Advanced Placement courses are offered beginning in 10th grade. Our students' SAT scores and 100 percent acceptance for college admission each year reflect the quality of our college preparatory curriculum. Over the past four school years, 61 students earned AP scholar recognition for their exceptional achievement on the College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) Program. This recognition included one National AP Scholar, two AP Scholars with Distinction, and five AP Scholars with Honor. Since 2007, Westfield has had two National Merit Finalists, three National Merit Semi-Finalists, eight National Merit Commended Scholars, thirteen Georgia Scholars, and two University of Georgia Ramsey Scholars. The Class of 2020 included one National Merit Commended Scholar. Over 90 percent of the Class of 2021 received the HOPE Scholarship with 36 percent of the class receiving the Zell Miller HOPE Scholarship. Each year, seventh grader students are selected each year for participation in the Duke University Talent Identification Program (TIP). This national search identifies academically-gifted seventh graders based on standardized test scores in specific content areas. Candidates who qualify are invited to take either the SAT or the ACT. Scores among our Lower and Middle School students on national standardized tests exceed the national benchmarks for each grade.

The Grade Level Equivalency score represents the typical performance of students tested in a given month of the school year at a particular grade. For example, Westfield's 8th graders in the 2020-2021 school year) overall grade equivalent score of 10.1 on the Core (Reading, Language, and Math) reflects the score that students finishing the first month of 10th grade would likely score on the Core test. The grade equivalent score helps to estimate the students' developmental status or year-to-year growth.



Curricular Emphasis for Lower School

Students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through grade five receive a strong foundation in academic instruction as they matriculate through the Lower School. Imbedded in the instruction throughout the day is an emphasis on Christian teaching including Biblical lessons and scripture. Teachers carefully plan the instruction to provide a nurturing and loving environment in which the young child can mature as a whole person and as a student. Our Lower School students develop pride and self-confidence through participation in classroom projects, reports, seasonal productions, and our annual Grandparents Day Program. The basis of curriculum is national standards in each academic discipline. Curriculum materials are selected from various publishers, to give a well-balanced and thorough preparation at each grade level.

Enrichment & Physical Education Programs

It is the philosophy of The Westfield School that a well-educated child is one who is exposed to a variety of worthwhile activities and introduced to areas of interest that he might not discover for himself. The Enrichment Program for Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 5 gives each child exposure to, and instruction in the fine arts, technology, physical health and education, library skills, all valuable tools for life-long learning.

Pre-Kindergarten & Kindergarten

Students in these grades attend a different enrichment each day. The following enrichments are emphasized at this level: Music, Physical Education, Technology, and Library.

Grades 1-3

Students in these grades attend a different enrichment each day. The following enrichments are emphasized at this level: Art, Music, Technology, Library, and Physical Education.

Grades 4-5

Students in these grades attend a different enrichment each day. The following enrichments are emphasized at this level: Art, Technology, Music, Writing, Chorus, and Physical Education.



Curricular Emphasis for Middle School

The Middle School at Westfield provides the students in grades six through eight with experiences and classroom settings to gently guide them from the structured Lower School environment to the responsibilities encountered with the full rotation of classes of the Upper School grades. Each grade level in Middle School provides a little more opportunity for the student to assume responsibility for himself in his academic surroundings. All of the programs and activities for the Middle School students serve to support the school's mission. Middle School students have the opportunity to learn outside the classroom through annual field trips, including a visit to Washington, D.C. for the eighth grade students. The curriculum included at these grade levels prepares the student for the college preparatory curriculum of the Upper School at Westfield.

The Middle School academic program is designed to meet the academic, social and emotional needs of adolescents and to encourage and assist in developing skills that will prepare them for transition to the Upper School. Curriculum materials are selected from various publishers to give a well-balanced and thorough preparation at each grade level.

Upper School Curriculum

Westfield's Upper School program offers a curriculum designed to support the school's mission, with depth and breadth to prepare students for quality colleges and universities. The curriculum builds on the skills and principles learned in the early and middle grades, developing intellectual curiosity and encouraging students to make learning a lifelong dedication. In addition to traditional courses in English, math, science, and social studies, all Westfield Upper School students are required to take a minimum of two years of a foreign language. Students may choose from a variety of electives including fine arts, advanced science courses, technology courses, journalism, and additional foreign language study. The Honors Program is offered to qualifying students in the disciplines of English, science, and math. Westfield's Advanced Placement program has earned full certification from the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) for its delivery of advanced placement curriculum of English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, United States History, European History, Psychology, Statistics, Calculus, and Art History. All advanced placement teachers have completed the College Board's certification process in the subject area(s) in which they teach and regularly attend workshops and seminars to remain current. Westfield students qualifying for the Advanced Placement program perform well on AP exams and have been awarded advanced standing by major colleges and universities. Dual enrollment courses are offered on the Westfield campus in partnership with Middle Georgia State University and Georgia Military College. Honors courses, AP courses, and Dual Enrollment program eligibility requires student's meeting minimum published scores and grade averages. **Honors, AP, and dual enrollment program eligibility requires student's meeting minimum published scores and grade averages.**

Athletics & Co-Curricular Activities

The Westfield School encourages students to participate in athletic activities as part of their school experience. More than 80 percent of our Middle and Upper School students are involved in athletic and/or other extracurricular activities. Fine Arts

Westfield offers art and music instruction to every student from Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade. By fifth grade, every Westfield student has sung and danced in musical productions, such as our annual Grandparents' Day performance, Second Grade's Mr. Popper's Performing Penguins, or First Grade's The First Thanksgiving. Upper School students compete annually in the GISA Region and State One Act Play competitions, and Westfield students have distinguished themselves on the stage in being selected as Outstanding Performers on both the region and state levels.

Middle and Upper School students participate in chorus, presenting an annual Christmas Concert and a Spring Concert. Students from our Chorus are selected each year to participate in the statewide Honor Chorus and Choirs, along with the GISA All State Chorus and Choir. Chorus and Drama students together perform in an annual Mid-Winter Production or Spring Musical.

Westfield students consistently receive top honors at the GISA State Literary Competition in the areas of Music, Chorus, Extemporaneous Speaking, Spelling, Oral Interpretation, and Essay. Middle School students participate in the annual GISA Spelling Competition. Students also compete annually in the Academic Bowl and in Debate.

Our academics focus not only on the traditional college preparatory, but also open the doors for our students to experience Debate, Fine Arts, Bible, Technology and other enrichment and elective courses. Westfield offers foreign language instruction beginning in Pre Kindergarten. Lower School students take field trips to museums and see theatrical performances. Middle School students have the opportunity to see history through a trip to Washington, D.C. Upper School students have the opportunity to travel abroad through school-sponsored trips.

Tuition Payments for the 2022-2023 school year begins in March 2022.

Families may choose one of three plans for the payment of tuition.

Annual – with 2.5% discount (discount not reflected in numbers above) within by March 15, 2022, or within 10 days of contact issue date

Semi Annual – with 1.25% discount (discount not reflected in numbers above) 50% due within 10 days of contract issue date and 50% due by August 1, 2022

Monthly – Twelve equal monthly payments billed March 2022 through February 2023

The first \$1,000 paid in tuition is considered a non-refundable Registration Fee.

Tuition includes the following:

- Textbooks and consumable educational materials such as workbooks, spelling books, and readers. Most field trip fees are covered in tuition.
- A student athletic pass for all home games in every sport (with the exception of playoff games and tournaments).
- A yearbook for each family. Additional yearbooks may be ordered and purchased.
- Grades 6-8: one (1) school-issued physical education uniform (others may be purchased for a minimal price).
- Grades 9, 10 and 11: the cost of the PSAT (preliminary SAT assessment given at the 10th and 11th grade levels).

Tuition does not include the following:

- Typical school supplies such as notebook paper, pencils, etc.
- School pictures, some field trip fees, and any overnight field trip expenses.
- School lunch
- Daily bus transportation to and from school
- Fees for national Advanced Placement exams and SAT/ACT tests for Upper School students
- Athletic participation fees (approximately \$25 - \$150 depending on activity and level of MS, JV, or Varsity)

Tuition Refund Insurance - Required for all new families for the first year

The Westfield School plans, budgets and contracts for services for the academic year in advance of student matriculation, therefore, the enrollment contract obligates families for the full amount of tuition and fees for the year, whether or not students are dismissed, withdraw or do not attend. Tuition Refund Insurance, through the services of A.W.G. Dewar Inc., is a service to families to assist them in meeting their contractual obligations to The Westfield School. The program insures fees (prepaid and due) in the event of separation from the school after actual enrollment has begun and the student has attended 14 consecutive calendar days of school. **Tuition Refund Insurance is required of new families. It may be billed as a one time charge or you may be billed in the first three monthly installments.** The annual premium is 2.4% of paid tuition. New Family Fee -- \$300 per Family

Families who have not had children enrolled in The Westfield School prior to the school term will be required to pay a New Family Fee. The fee is payable at the time of registration, or may be billed monthly. This fee is waived also for parents who are alumni of Westfield, Beechwood, or Baker.



Financial Aid, Fees, & Services

Financial Aid

The Westfield School offers a Financial Aid Program which provides need based financial assistance. The program is intended to assist those families who desire a Westfield education but might have difficulty with tuition costs. Westfield is also a participant in the Georgia GOAL Scholarship Program which provides tuition assistance on a needs basis to students who are enrolling in Pre-K, Kindergarten, or First Grade, or who are transferring from a Georgia public school. Students new to Westfield will be considered for financial aid only after they have applied for admission to the school. No full tuition aid is available. Please note that our financial aid dollars are very limited, especially in grades in which enrollment is at or near full capacity. All information, including the names of families seeking and receiving assistance, is kept strictly confidential. Financial aid requests should be made to Ms. Kris Taylor, Chief Financial Officer, ktaylor@westfieldschool.org.

Decisions on the financial aid applications (including Georgia GOAL) are made following the submission of a Parents' Financial Statement (which includes a copy of your most recent IRS 1040, W-2s, and application) to FACTS, and the subsequent report received by the school. Financial aid applications may be made following the student's acceptance for admission to Westfield. In case of separation or divorce, both parents must complete a Parents' Financial Statement and submit the appropriate tax information.

Financial aid awards are made based on demonstrated need and the availability of funds. Parents of all students who receive financial aid must apply for financial aid each year.

Dining Services

Food Service for The Westfield School is provided by FLIK Independent School Dining, a full service, national firm servicing schools and colleges. Lunch and Break are served to students daily on school days. Additional information on fees and registration for the meal plan is available on our school website and through the Business Office and the Admissions Office.

Transportation

The Westfield School provides transportation to and from school via pre-determined routes to several surrounding communities. The routes include Warner Robins, Hawkinsville, and Reynolds-Fort Valley-Byron.
