# The Westfield Lower School Summer Reading Program

School may be out for summer, but studies have shown that taking a break from reading can have a significant impact when students return to the classroom on August 9th. A summer off can mean the loss of six to nine months progress for some students. The key to preventing learning loss over summer break is simple — it's reading regularly. Setting aside as little as fifteen minutes each day for reading will make all the difference. Parents play a critical role in helping children follow through on this commitment during the summer months.

## Pre-K through 2nd Grade Summer Reading Log

*Students who are rising Pre-K-2nd grade will complete the reading log including in this packet to receive a special reward when school begins in August for their reading over the summer. Students should bring the reading log to their homeroom teacher when school begins.*

## Third - Fifth Grade Summer Reading and AR Testing

*Students who are rising 3rd-5th graders should not turn in a reading log. They will take AR tests on the books they read this summer. They will need to earn points through their AR tests (3 points for 3rd grade, 5 points for 4th and 5th grade) in order to receive a reward when school begins. Students who are new to Westfield for the 2022-2023 school year will receive an email with their child's log in information. Rising 5th graders cannot take the AR test on their required summer reading book (*Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing*). This test will be taken once we are in school so that the points can be applied to their 1st quarter goal.*

Here are some tips from *Read Naturally* for getting children engaged in and excited about reading this summer:

1. **Make a date with a librarian** — Librarians will help locate books based on interests and reading ability. Check out your library for summer reading programs and a huge supply of great books.
2. **Lead by example** — Actions speak louder than words so let your child see you reading the newspaper or curling up with a good book. For younger readers, go ahead and read together with you reading a page and them reading the next.
3. **See reading everywhere** — Show how important reading is in everyday life by asking them to read the recipe while you make something together or read signs as you go about your day.
4. **Read the book, then see the movie** — Use the excitement of an upcoming movie to get them to read the book. Then see the movie and discuss the differences between the two versions. They'll quickly learn that books are better. This can be done with videos as well.
5. **Bring books while you hit the highway** — Books are terrific because they are portable and don't need any batteries or wires. Audio books are also great for getting kids to see the value in stories found in books.
6. **Give TV a timeout** — According to a U.S. Department of Education study, the average kindergarten student has spent more than 5,000 hours watching television. Cutting down on TV time will create more time for your child to tune into reading.
