AP courses will be weighted with an additional 1.0 point to the weighted GPA score for the course. Dual enrollment classes receive no additional weight.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARS

Since 2007, Westfield has had two National Merit Finalists, three National Merit Semi-Finalists, and six National Merit Commended Scholars. The Class of 2017 included one National Merit Finalist and one Commended Scholar. The Classes of 2018 and 2020 each included one National Merit Commended Scholar. The Class of 2022 included one National Merit Finalist.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

In 2022, 70 Upper School students took a total of 105 Advanced Placement (AP) exams. Fifty-three percent of the students scored a 3 or higher. There were thirteen AP Scholars, including five AP Scholars with Distinction and one AP Scholars with Honor.
